Adults: \$3.00, children: \$1.50.

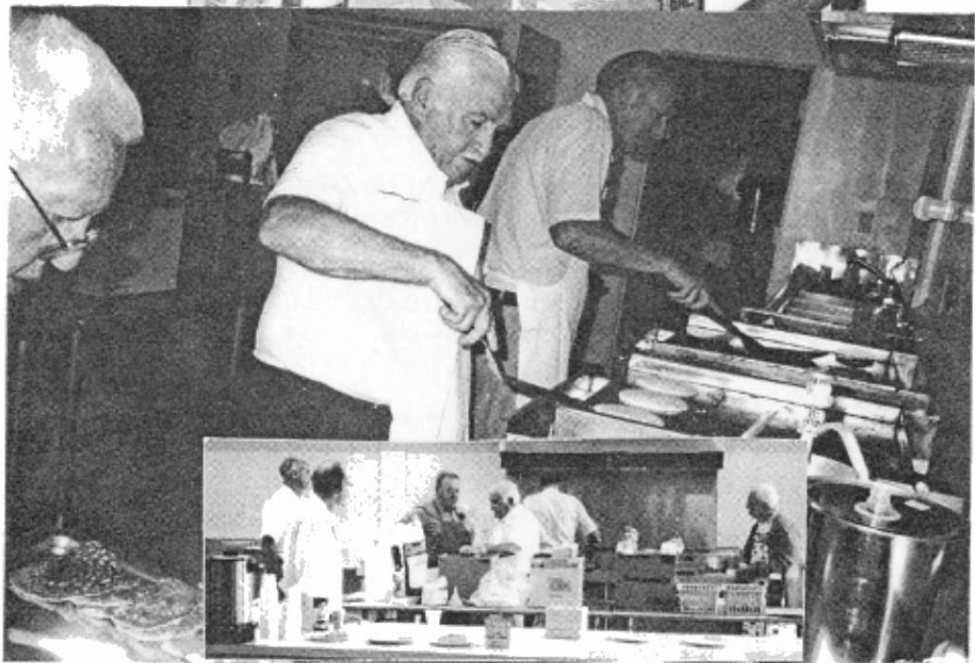
