IS THE ROSARY OUTDATED?

The Rosary is rooted in the universal, divine injunction to "pray without ceasing". It was designed by our Blessed Mother to facilitate this duty, for those unable to recite the Divine Office.

When the Rosary was first propagated by St. Dominic, it was actually begun with the same prayer as the Office: *Aperies os meum* (Thou shalt open my mouth). And it closes with the same prayer as the Office: *Salve Regina* (Hail Holy Queen).

The Feast of the Most Holy Rosary, October 7th, was instituted by Pope Gregory XIII. It was inserted into the Roman Martyrology by Pope Clement VII and extended to the universal Church by Pope Clement XI.

Pope Benedict XIII added it to the Breviary, and Leo XIII, the "Pope of the Rosary", dedicated the entire month of October to Our Lady of the Holy Rosary.

In 1569, Pope St. Pius V promulgated a Papal Bull, *Consueverunt* (They have become accustomed) establishing, canonically, the form in which the Rosary is to be prayed: 150 Hail Marys, in groups of 10, with an Our Father in between, joined to meditation on certain mysteries of the life of our Lord.

In 1891, Pope Leo XIII wrote an encyclical, *Octobri mense* (In the month of October), in which he stated: "We may well believe that the Queen of Heaven herself has granted a special efficacy to this mode of supplication...as a most powerful weapon against the enemies of the Faith in an epoch not unlike our own."

Lucy of Fatima tells us: "The repetition of the Ave Maria, Pater Noster, and Gloria Patri is the chain that lifts us right up to God and unites us to Him, giving us a participation in His divine life, just as eating bite after bite of bread, from which we nourish ourselves, sustains the natural life in us. Nobody calls that outdated!"

9. Concluding Prayers

Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, hail, our life, our sweetness, and our hope! To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to thee we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn, then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy towards us, and, after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O pious, O sweet Virgin Mary!

V. Queen of the most Holy Rosary, pray for us:

R. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

LET US PRAY

O God, whose only-begotten Son, by His life, death, and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech Thee, that, meditating upon these mysteries of the Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain, and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Surge With Service delineates the duties of seven directors:

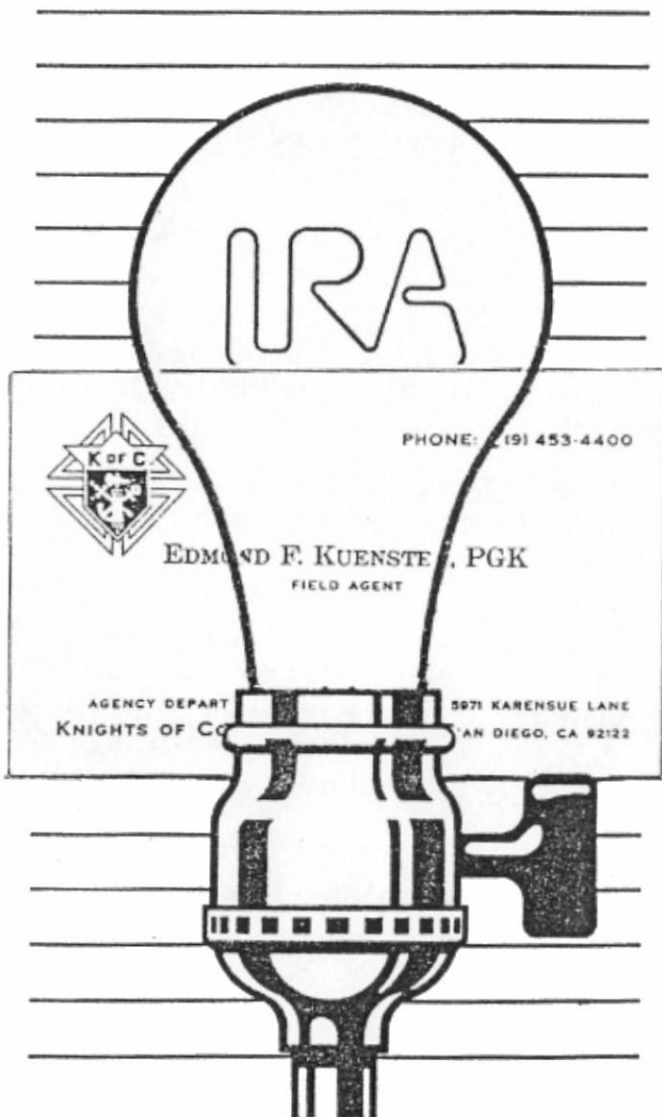
1. Program Director (Al Anderle);
