THE FIRST LANDING

At 2 A.M., October 12, Rodrigo de Triana, lookout on *Pinta*, sees something like a white cliff shining in the moonlight, and sings out, *Tierra! tierra!* "Land! land!" Captain Pinzón verifies the landfall, fires a gun as agreed, and shortens sail to allow the flagship to catch up. As *Santa María* approaches, the Captain General shouts across the rushing waters, "Señor Martín Alonso, you *did* find land! Five thousand maravedis for you as a bonus!"

Yes, land it was this time, a little island of the Bahamas group. The fleet was headed for the sand cliffs on its windward side and would have been wrecked had it held course. But these seamen were too expert to allow that to happen. The Captain General ordered sail to be shortened and the fleet to jog off and on until daylight, which was equivalent to a southwesterly drift clear of the island. At dawn they made full sail, passed the southern point of the island and sought an opening on the west coast, through the barrier reef. Before noon they found it, sailed into the shallow bay now called Long or Fernandez, and anchored in the lee of the land, in five fathoms.

Here on a gleaming beach of white coral occurred the famous first landing of Columbus. The Captain General (now by general consent called Admiral) went ashore in the flagship's boat with the royal standard of Castile displayed, the two Captains Pinzón in their boats, flying the banner of the Expedition—the green crowned cross on a white field. "And, all having rendered thanks to Our Lord, kneeling on the ground, embracing it with tears of joy for the immeasurable mercy of having reached it, the Admiral rose and gave this island the name *San Salvador*"—Holy Saviour.

In October, we commemorate Our Blessed Mother for her Maternity, her Purity, and, especially, her Most Holy Rosary:

- 7 Feast of the Most Holy Rosary
- 11 Maternity of the Blessed Virgin Mary
- 16 Purity of the Blessed Virgin Mary

THE ROSARY STORY

(From a 1961 pamphlet of THE ROSARY HOUR)

"Rosary" is from "rosarius", meaning a garland or bouquet of roses. According to an early legend, Our Blessed Mother took rosebuds from the lips of a young monk reciting Hail Marys, wove them into a garland, then placed it upon her head. ("Bead" comes from the Old Saxon "bede", meaning a prayer.)

The Catholic Encyclopedia, Vol. XIII, says: "Rosary - origin. The custom of reciting prayers upon a string with knots or beads thereon at regular intervals has come down from the early days of Christianity and is practiced in the Eastern as well as in the Western Church.

"At an early date among the Monastic Orders, the practice had established itself, not only of offering Masses, but of saying vocal prayers as a suffrage for their deceased brethren. For this purpose, the private recitation of the 150 Psalms - or of 50 Psalms, the third part - was constantly enjoined." Monks who were unable to recite the Psalms repeated, instead, the Hail Mary a like number of times.

The fourth Lesson for the Feast of the Most Holy Rosary in the Roman Breviary deals with the Albigensian heresy. When this heresy began devastating the country of Toulouse, early in the 13th Century, St. Dominic besought the help of Our Lady. According to tradition, she instructed him to preach the Rosary among the people, as an antidote to heresy and sin.

The Lesson goes on to say: "The Rosary is a certain form of prayer wherein we say 15 decades of Hail Marys, with an Our Father between

each 10, while, at each of the 15 decades, we recall successively, in pious meditation, one of the Mysteries of our Redemption."

SOME HISTORICAL EVENTS

1208 One night, according to tradition, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in the Chapel of Notre Dame at Prouille and commissioned him to preach devotion to the Rosary.

1213 In the crucial battle of Muret, Simon de Montfort, victorious over the Albigensians, attributed his victory to the power of the Rosary. As a token of his gratitude, he built the first Rosary Chapel at Muret.

1569 On September 17th, St. Pius V defined the devotion of the Rosary: "It is the Psalter of Mary, in which the Blessed Mother of God is greeted 150 times with the Angelical Salutation, corresponding to the Psalms of the Psalter of David, together with one Our Father for every 10 Hail Marys, and also certain meditations that present the entire life of Jesus Christ." The term "Our Lady's Psalter" can be traced back to the 13th Century.

1569 The Turks, at the height of their sea power in the Mediteranean, were threatening to overrun Europe. On September 17th, Pope Pius V ordered all Christians to pray the Rosary for success against the Mohammedans. On Sunday, October 7th, the Christian fleet attacked and defeated them in the Gulf of Lepanto. The Venetian Senate wrote: "It was not generals nor battalions nor arms that brought us victory; it was Our Lady of the Rosary." Pope St. Pius V perpetuated the memory of the victory of Lepanto by an annual commemoration of Our Lady of Victory. Pope Gregory XIII, his successor, changed the title back to Our Lady of the Rosary and appointed the first Sunday of October for the new feast.

1627 Before attacking the rebellious Huguenots in the fortress of La Rochelle, the French King Louis XIII ordered the public recitation of the Rosary. The Huguenots were defeated. The victory was accepted as a miracle of the Holy Rosary, in an official declaration by the University of Paris.

1683 While the battle of Lepanto broke the naval power of Islam, they were still powerful on land. On July 13th, the Turkish army, numbering 200,000, laid seige to Vienna. The fall of the city seemed certain. But Emperor Leopold placed all his hope in Our Lady of the Rosary. On September 12th, Feast of the Holy Name of Mary, King John Sobieski of Poland came to the rescue and defeated the Turks - another victory over the crescent.

1716 The Turks were still hopeful of being victorious over the Christians. But, on August 5th, Feast of Our Lady of the Snow, the Christians decisively defeated them, led by Prince Eugene of Savoy, at Peterwardein. Pope Clement XI attributed this victory to the devotion of the Christians, through the Rosary, to Our Lady of Victory. In gratitude, Pope Clement inscribed the Feast of the Holy Rosary on the universal calendar.

1846 The First Council of Baltimore decreed Mary, in her Immaculate Conception, principal Patron of the United States.

1847 On February 7th, the bishops of the U.S. confirmed the Baltimore decree: "We solemnly and unanimously place the Catholic Church in America under the special patronage of the Blessed Virgin."

1854 On december 8th, Pope Pius IX solemnly proclaimed the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception.

1858 The Blessed Virgin appeared 18 times to Bernadette Subirous, at Lourdes, France. Taking a chaplet from her own arm, Mary encouraged Bernadette, by example, to say her beads and recommended the Rosary to the world.

1876 Our Blessed Mother appeared at Pompeii, Italy, to Fortuna Agrelli, who had been pronounced incurably ill. Mary said: "Since you have called me by the title so pleasing to me, 'Queen of the Holy Rosary', I can no longer refuse the favor you ask." Fortuna recovered from her 'incurable' illness.

Our Mother of Confidence parishioners have sent over 900 petition signatures to Channel 10. Our Council's Decency Chairman, Bob Warner, and DD 101 (our PGK) Ray Flynn delivered most of them.

Bob also had letters published in **The University City Light** and **The San Diego Union-Tribune**, soliciting action from the general public to get the series stopped.

As Chairman of the OMC Parish Peace and Justice Ministry, Bob sent a copy of the petition to Mark Brumley, Chairman of the Office of Social Ministries for the SD Diocese. Brumley wrote an article in support of our efforts for the August 26th **Southern Cross**.

Ray Flynn presented a petition form at the SD KofC Chapter Meeting in August. All of the officers, representing all of the KofC Councils in San Diego County, signed it.

SD Chapter President Len Brzezinski sent the petition with a cover letter to Channel 10.

With God's help and a lot of positive action by concerned citizens, this pornographic TV program - and subsequent programs of the same ilk - can and will be stopped.

NYPD BLAH

JUST STOP PICKING ON COLUMBUS!

Let him be. Stop picking on Christopher Columbus. He's a legend, and America needs legends, so back off.

America's revisionist academics seem bent on character assassination of a hero long dead. They're punching him in the knees with their tiny fists.

Male chauvinist, they call him. Antagonistic to basic American values, they claim. That is a stretch, a long one, since basic American values did not exist in 1492.

Columbus was a founder of colonialism, they sniff with pompous self-righteousness, and sympathetic to slavery. A lousy sailor, terrible navigator, mistaken geographer. No one else of his time did what he did. No one else made four voyages from the Old World to the New, over uncharted waters, to an unknown land. Let his magnificent, courageous voyages continue to receive deserved approbation.

"As a seaman", writes historian Samuel Eliot Morrison, "Columbus was one of the greatest in history." Morrison, who won the Pulitzer Prize for his 1942 biography of Columbus, wasn't in the business of destroying legends or warping the truth. Not as much can be said of today's anti-Columbus twits.
