In time of prosperity, fill our hearts with thankfulness, and, in the day of trouble, suffer not our trust in Thee to fail.

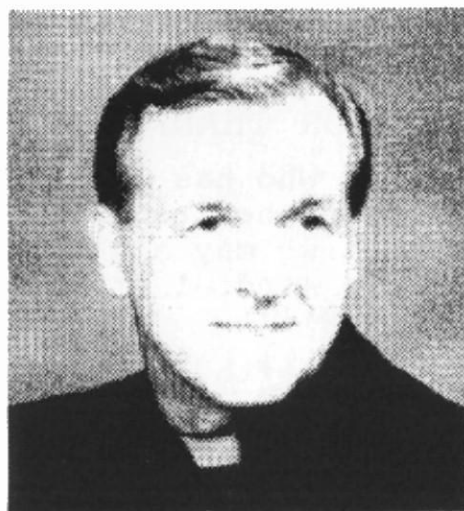

MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN

THE RITE/RIGHT OF CHRISTIAN BURIAL

From time immemorial, the Church has always shown great care for the dying person, reverence for the deceased, even in times of fiercest persecution. Just witness the Catacombs, the earliest burial sites for the Martyrs.



The Church, as "Sacred Assembly", gathers for the Vigil or "night watch". This "Wake Service" awaited dawn or resurrection with Christ. Still today, there are readings from the Sacred Scriptures and Prayers of Commendation of the Deceased unto eternal glory, followed by the Mass of Christian Burial and the final rite of committal. (This is greatly expanded in the new "Order of Christian Burials", revised and restored by the Catholic Church in 1989.)

It is this newly promulgated RITE to which you, as one of the Baptized Faithful, have a RIGHT. Did we not pray throughout our lifetimes, especially in the ancient "Litany of the Saints": "Lord, preserve us from a sudden and unprovided death."? Did not "The King of Love (who) my Shepherd is..." promise: "All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and whoever comes to Me I shall not turn away."? (John 6, 37)



Yet, it must be insisted: DO stipulate a Mass of Christian Burial, if not also a Wake Service, in your Last Will and Testament and/or in your Deed of Living Trust.

True, cremation is permissible again in Catholic burial rites, so long as no denial of bodily resurrection is intended. Nevertheless, in the absence of the cremains of the faithful member and, especially if the partner has already preceded in death, will the offspring know to secure the Christian honors due to one who has died in Christ? So often, even the cremains are absent, since no provision has been made for a suitable "funeral arch" or small bronze or metallic case, "Tabernacle-like", for those cremains.

However, the rental of a casket, so that the remains may receive proper honors at the Mass of Christian Burial prior to cremation, is not out of the question. Again, stipulate that, yes, you do: (1) desire a Mass of Remembrance; surely your children will honor the request, even should they no longer be in active practice of the Catholic Faith; (2) STIPULATE that, in lieu of flowers, Holy Masses be offered for the repose of your soul; (3) SUGGEST your desire for a Vigil Service, if not at home, then in the mortuary or crematory.

All the above and much more can be arranged through direct contact with your parish MINISTRY OF GRIEVING. That team is coordinated in Our Mother of Confidence Parish by Carolyn Heintz, together with Margaret Gurney, Liturgy Chairperson, and Charlotte Dean, Music Director. Their visit(s) to the grieving family take note of prefuneral arrangements: a Vigil Service, with a biography and selection of readings, appropriate songs, and prayers. They contact the gathered family, so as to elicit stories and photographs and to promote family contributions to a possible collage of same. They are in touch with Church sacristans and, most important, with the priest/celebrant/homilist.

Then do stipulate in writing your RITE/RIGHT OF CHRISTIAN BURIAL. Don't be caught dead without it!

THE ROSARY STORY (Cont.)
HISTORICAL EVENTS (Cont.)

1883-1898 Between 1 September 1883 and 5 September 1898, Pope Leo XIII wrote one Apostolic Letter and 10 Encyclical Letters on the Most Holy Rosary. In his Apostolic Constitution "Ubi Primum", of 2 October 1898, he stated: "The true form of the Rosary is to be preserved in reference to the beads by making them up into five, 10, or 15 decades: likewise that other beads, of whatever form, are not to be known by the name of Rosary."

1917 Mary appeared six times, at Fatima, Portugal, to three children: Lucia dos Santos and Francisco and Jacinta Marto. Her main injunction was to "say the Rosary every day."

1930 On October 13th, after 13 years of investigation by the Canonical Commission, it was proclaimed that the visions at Fatima were worthy of credence and that the devotion to Our Lady of Fatima was officially approved.

1931 On May 13th, Portugal was consecrated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary at Fatima.

1937 In his Encyclical Letter on the Rosary, September 29th, Pope Pius XI proclaimed: "Among the various supplications with which we successfully appeal to the Virgin Mother of God, the Holy Rosary, without doubt, occupies a special and distinct place...We do not wish here to pass over in silence the fact that the Blessed Virgin herself, even in our times, has solicitously recommended this manner of prayer when she appeared and taught it to the innocent girl in the grotto of Lourdes."

1942 Pope Pius XII, in his broadcast to the people of Portugal, on October 31st, at the closing of the Fatima "Silver Jubilee" celebrations, consecrated the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

1950 On November 1st of this Holy Year, Pope Pius XII solemnly proclaimed the Dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven.

1951 On September 15th, in his Encyclical Letter on the Rosary, Pope Pius XII stated: "It is above all in the bosom of the family that we desire the custom of the Holy Rosary to be everywhere adopted, religiously preserved, and evermore intensely practiced...We do not hesitate to affirm again publicly that we put great confidence in the Holy Rosary for the healing of evils which afflict our times."

1952 On July 7th, Pope Pius XII consecrated Russia "in a most special way" to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. (Feast day: August 22)

1954 This Marian Year was the 100th anniversary of the proclamation of the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception. On October 11th, Pope Pius XII, in his Encyclical Letter, "Ad Caeli Reginam", proclaimed the universal Feast of the Queenship of Mary. "Therefore, by Our Apostolic authority, We decree and institute the Feast of Mary, Queen, to be celebrated every year in the whole world on May 31st."

1984 Pope John Paul II requested public Rosaries For Peace rallies throughout the U.S., from July 15th until the end of October.

THE FEAST OF ALL SAINTS

"BY THEIR FRUITS YOU WILL KNOW THEM!"

It is one of the characteristics of the Catholic Church that it has been able to number among its members those who have reached the highest degrees of sanctity. Moreover, it has been able to do this from the very beginning. Hundreds of such exceptional examples of holiness appear in every age. But the first three centuries were as productive as any in the numbers that the Church inspired to sainthood.

Nor is the Church in the habit of investing its members with sainthood lightly. Far from calling all its members saints, She insists that the holiness of sanctity is something totally beyond the power of unassisted human nature.

The Church requires, first of all, a meticulous practice of all the Christian virtues. Another attribute of the Christian ideal of holiness is love of suffering. Not as though pleasure were an evil in itself, but because suffering is the greatest means by which our love of God is intensified and purified. It is a well-known fact that those who have attained a high degree of holiness have learned to rejoice in suffering, because, by it, their love of God was freed from every element of self-seeking, making their lives conform to that of the Master.

It has also been noted that, when holiness reaches a sublime degree, it is frequently accompanied by miraculous powers. Our Lord promised that this sign would not be lacking in His Church. As we read in St. Mark, Chapter 16, and St. John, Chapter 14, Christ said that the miracles which His followers would perform would be no less stupendous than the miracles He Himself worked during His life here on earth.

Armistice Day, 1918. The end of the World War (later designated WWI). The day on which, for over 30 years, the veterans of that War to End All Wars were commemorated for their patriotism and bravery.

ABSOLUTE SEPARATION OF CHURCH AND STATE?

Was the basic goal of the Establishment Clause of the First Amendment absolute separation of the spheres of religious activity and civil authority?

If so, why did the first House of Representatives, after voting up the amendment, ask President Washington to issue a proclamation, recommending to the people of the U.S. "a day of public thanksgiving and prayer, to be observed by acknowledging, with grateful hearts, the many signal favors of Almighty God"?

It was certainly not a commitment to absolute separation of Church and State which led President Washington to issue the new nation's first Thanksgiving Day proclamation. And it was not adherence to an absolute Establishment Clause when Presidents John Adams and James Madison also issued Thanksgiving Day Proclamations.

No commitment to absolute separation of Church and State is evident in the First Congress, when it set up a congressional chaplain system and voted a \$500 annual salary for the Senate and House chaplains. Their principal duties were to offer audible public prayers in Congress.

No absolute interpretation of the principle of separation of Church and State led President Thomas Jefferson - one year after he coined his famous "wall of separation" - to sign a tax exemption bill for the churches in Alexandria County in 1802. And it was not an absolutist action when Jefferson, in 1803, concluded a treaty with the Kaskaskia Indians, calling for the U.S. to build them a Roman Catholic church and pay their priest.

It seems axiomatic that the original principle of separation of Church and State in the First Amendment must be one which reconciles the prohibitions of the Establishment Clause and the sectarian practices of the Republic's earliest Administrations and Congresses. A "nonabsolute" interpretation of separation of Church and State seems to do just that.
